Aviation Application Overview

Enrollment in the Aviation program is limited. You must apply and be selected for admission. To be considered for admission, you <u>must</u> meet the admission requirements. If you do not meet the stated requirements, your application will be withdrawn from consideration.

Point System

Acceptance into the Aviation program is determined by a weighted point system based on the 5 categories listed below.

- Aviation Program Requirements/KCC Application
- Math Placement
- Writing Placement
- Resume
- Essay

Aviation Program Admission Requirements

Aviation program enrollment is limited. Acceptance into the Aviation program is determined by using a weighted point system (14 points) from a pool of qualified applicants. A student must meet the minimum requirements to be considered for admission. If the minimum requirements have been met, the students' application will be evaluated and awarded points in a competitive process. The top-ranking individuals will be admitted to the program. Remaining qualified candidates are placed on a ranked alternate list.

Minimum Evaluation Requirements

If we have met our maximum number of students for the quarter, then you may be placed on a waiting list and/or placed on the next term start date.

- ☐ Step 1: Completion of KCC Aviation Program Requirements including KCC application; (1-2 points)
 - 2 points if completed greater than 30 days before the program start date
 - 1 point if completed less than 30 days before the program start date
- Step 2: Math and Writing Placement Tests You will need 2 placement tests, Writing and Math, if you do not have prior college transcripts with these classes. You will need your KCC Student ID to take the tests.
 - Math (1-3 points)
 - 3 Points for placement into Math 111 or higher
 - 2 Points for placement into Math 095 or 105
 - 1 point for placement into Math 070 or lower
 - Writing (1-3 points)
 - 3 points for a writing score 255 to 300
 - 2 points for a writing score 235 to 254

 - Please attach a 1-page (max) cover letter and a 2-page (max) resume. Please note that we are not
 evaluating how much you have done, but instead, how/what you have done. Even if your resume
 does not have much to it, we want to know your level of attention to detail for the completion of a
 resume.
 - This will be evaluated by KCC and Pureflight Aviation staff
- ☐ Step 4: Essay (1-3 points)
 - As part of your application to the aviation program, please submit a short essay (approximately 500 words) that helps us get to know you and evaluate your readiness for success in training. Your essay must address the following topics:
 - Who you are: Tell us about yourself. Share relevant personal background, interests, or experiences that shape who you are.
 - Your aviation goals: What are your short-term and long-term goals in aviation?
 - Why this program? Why do you want to be part of this aviation program? What motivates you, and why do you believe this is the right fit?
 - Time management: How do you plan to manage your time and stay organized while balancing flight training, ground school, studying, and your personal life?
 - Please ensure your essay:
 - Is written in your own words and reflects your personality, values, and goals.
 - o Is clear, well-structured, and stays focused on the required topics.
 - Is free from major grammar or spelling issues.
