Thank you for your interest in Klamath Community College's Nursing Assistant Training Course (HEA 100). HEA 100 is a 5-credit course designed to prepare students for the Oregon State Board of Nursing: Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) exam and workforce at an entry level position. Course components include classroom lecture/skills lab, and clinical practice in a healthcare setting. **Successful course completion does not guarantee state certification.**

This course is no longer web restricted. Current students may apply online. If you will be a first-time credit student at KCC, speak with a Student Services Representative for information about registration, admissions, financial aid, and transferring credit for any college work completed elsewhere. You can stop by Student Services or call 541-882-3521 with questions.

Orientation contains the required dates and times of sensitive steps. So please read the information carefully on: <https://www.klamathcc.edu/en-US/academics/academic-programs/science-health-science/nursing-assistant.html>. Be proactive about the requirements. **By Friday of the first week of the term**, on the drop date, you must complete:

- a CPR class for health care providers by the American Heart Association;
- immunizations for:
 - Hep B,
 - Tdap,
 - MMR, and
 - Varicella, or
 - Proof of immunity;
- background check returned with cleared results; and
- drug screens returned with cleared results.

TB testing or blood draw will start in the first week of class to show evidence of a negative TB status or documentation within six months prior to entry. This must be completed **at least two weeks prior to clinical rotations**. If not completed, the student will not be able to attend clinical and need to withdrawal.

You may register and join orientation on the first day of class. Enrollment is limited and on a first-come, first-serve basis. Contact Student Services, or me, with questions that may arise. Be proactive to complete the above items. Best wishes as you begin a new adventure!
