## General Information

Thank you for your interest in Klamath Community College's LPN to RN bridge program. We offer an Associate of Science in Nursing (RN). Current enrollment is limited to eight LPN to RN bridge students per year; four slots for currently practicing LPNs and four slots for our current (L)PN students who started their program in 2022.

The application for admission opens January 9, 2023 and closes April 17, 2023. If accepted, current (L)PN students will begin nursing classes **Fall term, 2023**. This packet has been prepared to help you understand the application and selection process. ### Associate Degree Nursing (LPN to AAS-Nursing - RN Bridge Program )

After successfully completing the final three terms in KCC's AAS-Nursing (RN) program, students will receive an Associate of Applied Science in Nursing and can take the licensing exam for registered nursing (RN). Students will also then qualify to enter most RN to Bachelor of Science in Nursing (RN-BSN) programs. Additional prerequisites may be required prior to acceptance in a RN-BSN program. Klamath Community College maintains a co-admission agreement with Linfield University. Linfield University offers an online RN-BSN degree.

## Nursing Application Overview

Enrollment in the nursing program is limited. You must apply and be selected for admission. To be considered for admission, you must meet the minimum requirements. If you do not meet the stated minimum requirements, your application will be withdrawn from consideration.

### Point System

Acceptance into the LPN to RN Bridge Nursing program is determined by a weighted point system based on categories listed below.

#### Current KCC (L)PN students:

- Cumulative individual exam/assessment scores/clinical evaluation in NSG 110, NSG 111, and NSG 112 plus labs/clinical
- Interview

### Nursing Program Admission Requirements

Nursing program enrollment is limited. Acceptance into the Nursing program is determined using a weighted point system from a pool of qualified applicants. A student must meet the minimum requirements to be considered for admission. If the minimum requirements have been met, the student's application will be evaluated and awarded points in a competitive process. The top ranking individuals will be offered admission to the program. Remaining qualified candidates are placed on a ranked alternate list which expires when fall term 2023 commences. Program information and application packets will be updated annually and can be obtained from the College website.

MINIMUM EVALUATION REQUIREMENTS for current KCC (L)PN students – must be met by the published application deadline and maintained through spring term 2023.

- ☐ Successful completion of NSG 110, NSG 110C, NSG 111, NSG 111C: Student will be required to successfully complete NSG 112 and NSG 112C by end of spring term 2023, and successfully achieve Oregon State Board of Nursing licensure as a Practical Nurse prior to fall term 2023 start.
- ☐ Admission and good standing in KCC's (L)PN program (absence of performance **contracts** since admission).

## Application Submission

There is ONE application deadline date to pay attention to: **Monday, April 17, 2023 at 5 p.m.**

All applications and transcripts from past coursework are due at the time of submitting the application.

Applications submitted after April 17, 2023, will not be accepted.

### **Current KCC (L)PN Student Applicants:**

If selected for the Nursing program, you must complete all first year nursing courses (NSG 110, NSG 111, NSG 112 plus labs/clinicals), as determined by the Klamath Community College Registrar's Office with a grade of "C" or above, and obtain a current LPN license from the Oregon State Board of Nursing *before the start of Fall Term 2023.*

## Current KCC (L)PN Students:

### Evaluating Nursing Applications

1. Cumulative Individual Unit and Final Exam Scores in NSG 110, NSG 111, and NSG 112 & ATI Proctored Assessments – **Maximum: 50 points**

3.9 – 4.0 = 50

3.8 – 3.89 = 48

3.7 – 3.79 = 46

Etc.

2. Cumulative Clinical Evaluation Scores in NSG 110C, NSG 111C, NSG 112C – **Maximum: 30 points**

Former Lab/Clinical Faculty will score the previously completed final clinical evaluation tools using documented comments and their professional judgement to rate the student's past clinical performance. First time math competency scores and skills lab re-demonstrations will also be considered.

3. Panel Interview - **Maximum 20 points**

The current KCC (L)PN applicants will be invited to participate in a panel interview. Up to 20 points may be awarded based on cumulative scores submitted by the interview panel using a rubric for appearance and responses.

I understand that I will be asked to consent to a urine drug screen for any signs of impairment while in the clinical setting and will be dismissed from the program if the screen is positive for any substances.
