Introduction to Skilled Trades

Program length:
10 weeks



Consisting of classroom instruction and hands-on skills labs, in this course students will learn how to operate power tools and machinery, read blue prints, basic rigging and knot tying, and how to perform basic construction math. Students will receive specialized training in forklift operation, materials handling, and OSHA 10 safety. Students enrolled in this program will have an opportunity to earn multiple certificates accredited by the National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER).

Program length:

This course will cover basics in carpentry and will include the use of power tools, blueprint drawing, and basic building. Successful completion of this course will result in a nationally recognized credential with the National Center for Construction Education & Research (NCCER). Requires completion of Introduction to Skilled Trades. Students enrolled in this program must also complete Introduction to Skilled Trades, either prior to or at the same time as Carpentry I.

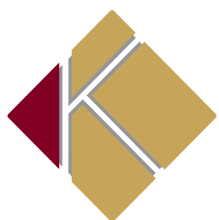
Commercial Drivers License

Program length:
5 weeks



Commercial Driving provides training to help students gain the qualifications to obtain a commercial driver license (CDL) and job in the industry. The course covers all of the aspects needed to safely operate a vehicle and complete a CDL test. Applicants will need to obtain and submit a copy of their DMV driving record showing their history of traffic accidents, violations, and/or convictions (including DUI, license suspensions, etc.). Participants will also be required to pass a drug screen prior to the start of training.

Prices and Fees for WCE Classes:

The price for non-credit classes varies and is published in the Workforce and Community Education class schedule each term. Payment is due before the first day of class. Some courses may require additional fees for materials, certification, or equipment.

All KCC Workforce Education courses will include a \$35 fee that will provide students with a student ID, as well as access to the Learning Resource Center, Tutoring Center, campus events, and free use of Basin Transit buses to and from KCC.

Winter Courses A - Z

BCTX 700 01 Core Curriculum Intro to Skilled Trades

Prerequisite to all other Level 1 craft curriculum. Its cover topics such as Basic Safety, Communication Skills, Introduction to Construction Drawings and Introduction to Construction Math. Completing this curriculum gives the trainee the basic skills needed to continue education in any craft area he or she chooses. This course presents basic job-site safety information to prepare workers for the construction environment. Describes the common causes of workplace incidents and accidents and how to avoid them. Introduces common PPE, including equipment required for work at height, and its proper use. Information related to safety in several specific environments, including welding areas and confined spaces. This course also contains: CPR/First Aid/AED, OSHA Forklift Safety, OSHA 10 and Flagger & Work Zone Traffic Control.

BUSX 721 01 Earn Extra Money with a Mystery Shopping Business

Have you seen ads telling you how to become a shopper, but only if you send them a lot of money? You do not have to pay to begin your new career in this exciting field. You will learn how to sign up with many legitimate mystery shopping companies without fees, avoid the pitfalls and scams, create a required mystery shopping resume and profile, and take care of legalities and taxes regarding this income. DSTX 700 01 Commercial Driver Training

Commercial Driving provides training to help students gain the qualifications to obtain a commercial driver license (CDL) and job in the industry. The course covers all of the aspects needed to safely operate a vehicle and complete a CDL test.

Applicants will need to obtain and submit a copy of their DMV driving record showing their history of traffic accidents, violations, and/or convictions (including DUI).

ESHX 712 01 OSHA 10 General Industry

This 10-hour OSHA course will provide the basics of occupational safety and health. The training program is intended to provide entry-level general industry workers information about their rights, employer responsibilities, and how to file a complaint, as well as how to identify, abate, avoid, and prevent job-related hazards. Training topics will introduce employees to the basic practices of identifying, reducing, eliminating, and reporting hazards associated with their work. Course outcomes include increasing worker safety and helping employers decrease costs associated with accidents. **The 10-hour General Industry training provides workers with knowledge about OSHA walking, working surfaces, and fall protection.**

ESHX 712 03 OSHA Forklift Safety

You will learn about the OSHA rules for Powered Industrial Trucks and developing a forklift training program. This class does not offer forklift operator certification (cards).

HEAX 701 01 Boat Safety

All Oregon boaters 12 years and older must pass an Oregon boaters education course and carry a boater education card when operating power boats greater than 10 horsepower. Students who pass this course can apply for a boater education card as required by Oregon's mandatory boater education program. This course covers practical boating safety information and regional and local boating rules and regulations, as well as tips and techniques for making boating more enjoyable. Those who successfully complete this course are issued a certificate of completion, which is the first step in obtaining a boater education card. You will need to fill out an official application form, and send it into the Marine Board along with \$20 and a copy of your certificate of completion to obtain your boater education card. This course is taught by certified Oregon State Marine Board instructors in a positive and informative classroom environment. Pre-registration is required.

HEAX 703P 01 First Aid/ CPR

The American Heart Association Heartsaver First Aid with CPR and AED training are included in this course designed for individuals seeking First Aid and CPR certification. Student materials include adult, child, and infant CPR and AED information. Satisfactory completion of all skills testing is required to receive the AHA First Aid and CPR card, which will be emailed to students within two weeks. Must provide a working email address.

HEAX 703P 02 CPR for Healthcare Providers

This classroom format is ideal for those who prefer group interaction and feedback from the instructor. Student materials include adult, child, and infant CPR and AED information. The American Heart Association-HEALTHCARE Providers Basic Life Support course completion card is valid for two years and is required for all healthcare providers. During the course, an AHA instructor conducts video-based lessons and works with students to complete skills practice. Satisfactory completion of a written test and skills testing are required to receive the AHA Healthcare Provider card, which will be emailed to students within two weeks of completion. Must have email address on file.

HEAX 743 01 Medical Assistant I

The Medical Assistant Course will prepare students for the CCMA NHA Exam and prepare them to work in the medical field as Medical Assistants. The course covers 110 hours of lecture from materials found in the NHA study guide as well as hands-on MA duties such as taking vitals/anthropometrics, phlebotomy, EKG, and other procedures correlating with the Medical Assistant scope of practice. Upon graduation from the course, students will complete 90 hours of clinical rotations in the Medical Assistant field and qualify to sit for the NHA exam.

HEAX 744 01 Pharmacy Technician I

This 20 week program will prepare students for an entry-level pharmacy technician position in both community and health system pharmacy settings. A pharmacy technician, under the supervision of a pharmacist, assists in the day-to-day pharmacy operations which do not require the professional judgment of a pharmacist. These operations include: entering prescription orders, packaging and labeling prescriptions, operating automated dispensing devices, maintaining inventories, processing insurance claims, compounding sterile medications, reconciling medications, assisting with medication therapy management, and using mathematics to solve various calculations including flow rates, days supplies, and individual and daily doses. Graduates are eligible to take the Exam for Certification of Pharmacy Technicians (ExCPT). Applications require proof of age and proof of high school diploma/ GED. Must pass math test.

PEDX 707 02 Waltz for Fun and Fitness

Waltz is one of the most romantic and elegant dances. With long sweeping movements and constant rotating with stylish poses. Great for dancing at weddings!

PEDX 707 03 Night Club Two Step

The Nightclub Two Step, originally called Disco Two Step, is a slow dance that was created for use on small dance floors, especially in cocktail lounges. Night Club Two Step is danced on the downbeat while the "essence" of the dance pulses the upbeat with a subtle upward tilt of the body. Synopsis of the class includes: basic structure, rhythm & step pattern, inside & outside turns, left & right turning basics, and toss across-- all of which will lead you to better coordination and physical ability. No class January 21st.

PEDX 707 04 Country Two Step

Country Two Step is a partnered dance and the country Western dancer's version of the ballroom dancer's foxtrot. It's a smooth, flowing dance while traveling around the dance floor using upper body choreography involving spins, wraps, and weaving movements. Enjoy the increased stamina and endurance that this dance provides you!

PEDX 707N 02 Argentine Tango for Fun and Fitness

Argentine Tango is an improvised, spontaneous dance, which is based on variations of walking, turning, pausing and adornments. Argentine tango is often danced in close embrace, or salon style. Even though there is a basic structure and certain rules to be followed, the dancers can never truly predict how their partner will interpret the music, construct a dance, or embellish it.

TEXX 702P 01 Flagger & Work Zone Traffic Control

Flagger and Work Zone Traffic Control covers the fundamental principles of traffic control, the five parts of temporary traffic control zones, and regulations regarding the primary traffic control devices and their proper placement. Correct flagging techniques will also be taught and demonstrated. This course meets the requirements of the Oregon Department of Transportation construction specifications. Students will receive a certification card, valid for three years, that verifies completion of safety training that meets ODOT requirements. Pre-registration is required.

WRIX 701 01 How to Write Your Life Story

Writing stories is a memoir writing class. This course will help you turn your memories into personal stories -- stories you can share now or save for future generations.

WRIX 702 03 Beginner's Guide to Getting Published

If your goal is to become a published freelance writer by selling a magazine article, short story, poem, or even a novel to a traditional publisher, this comprehensive workshop will guide you to, then past the editor's desk. You will discover how to: become a published writer overnight, submit manuscripts the correct way, find the right publisher for your work, write irresistible query letters, determine when and how to get an agent, and 100 ways to make money as a freelance writer. A detailed tutorial will be emailed to set up a free Zoom account. The webinar login information and materials will be sent the day of class.

WRIX 702 04 Explore 50 Different Self Publishing Options

WRIX 702 05 Introduction to Screenwriting for Television or Movies

In this comprehensive session, students will learn about special screenwriting terms and formats for television and the big screen. Students will also learn how to plot a story, develop characters, and execute your work in the proper screenwriting format. Students will discover the difference between a treatment, a spec script and a shooting script, and when to do each. Students will also get an inside look into the business of selling your script to agents and producers. The instructor is a journalist, author, screenwriter, agent, publisher, and adjunct online Professor of Publishing for Harvard. A detailed tutorial will be emailed to set up a Zoom account. The webinar login information and materials will be sent the day of class.

WRIX 702 06 Meet the Agent/Publisher - Get Your Manuscript Critiqued

Have you ever wanted to talk to a real agent or publisher? Are you tired of having your manuscripts critiqued by non-professionals or paying an editor too much money to change your writing to their voice? Email one page of your in-progress manuscript for an in-class critique of your poetry, article, short story, screenplay, novel, non-fiction book, or children's book. (Optional: You can then send your manuscript for a professional critique (for a critique fee of \$50 for up to 25 double-spaced pages, plus \$1/page thereafter, and a list of publishers/agents who are interested in your type of work.) The instructor is a journalist, author, screenwriter, agent, publisher, and adjunct online Professor of Publishing for Harvard. A detailed tutorial will be emailed to set up a free Zoom account. The webinar login information and materials will be sent the day of class.

WRIX 702 07 Writing for Online Blogs, Magazines & Websites

You don't need a journalism degree or previously published articles to write for anyone's online blog, magazine, or website. Some opportunities offer exposure, while many pay well — \$1 a word and more. In this fast-paced session, you will learn how to: find ideas, sources, and more than 1,000 opportunities that pay, conduct interviews and create interesting content, protect your copyright, write query letters, and then use this credibility to sell other articles or even your self published novel. WRIX 702 08 Beginner's Guide to Starting a FREE Blog
