Introduction to Skilled Trades

Are you interested in learning basic construction skills? Do you want to enroll in a craft/trade workforce program at Klamath Community College (KCC)? Then Introduction to Skilled Trades is the course for you!

Introduction to Skilled Trades at Klamath Community College is a 10-week course that is a prerequisite to all other craft curriculum. This means if you are interested in completing a workforce program like Carpentry I, you will need to complete Introduction to Skilled Trades first.

In the course you will learn important fundamentals such as how to operate power tools and construction machinery. You will learn skills such as blueprint reading, basic rigging, and knot tying. You will also be introduced to basic construction math.

In addition to basic skills, you will receive specialized training in forklift operation, hazardous materials training, and Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) 10 safety. You will have the opportunity to earn multiple industry recognized certificates accredited by the National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER). The NCCER is recognized by the construction industry as the training, assessment, certification, and career development standard for construction and maintenance craft professionals.

Prices and Fees for Classes:

The price for non-credit classes varies and is published in the Workforce and Community Education class schedule online each term. Payment is due before the first day of class. Some courses may require additional fees for materials, certification, or equipment.

All KCC Workforce Education courses will include a \$35 fee that will provide students with a student ID, as well as access to the Learning Resource Center, Tutoring Center, campus events, and free use of Basin Transit buses to and from KCC.

Payment

Descriptions

Commercial Drivers License

Commercial Driving provides training to help students gain the qualifications to obtain a commercial driver's license (CDL) and job in the industry. The course covers all of the aspects needed to safely operate a vehicle and complete a CDL drive test. Applicants will need to obtain and submit a copy of their DMV driving record showing their history of traffic accidents, violations, and or convictions (including DUI). Participants will also be required to pass a drug screening prior to the start of training.

First Aid/CPR

The American Heart Association Heartsaver First Aid with CPR and AED training are included in this course designed for individuals seeking First Aid and CPR certification. Student materials include adult, child, and infant CPR and AED information. Satisfactory completion of all skills testing is required to receive the AHA First Aid and CPR card, which will be emailed to students within two weeks. Students must have their email address on file. Instructor: Adam Alcorn. Cost: \$95

CPR for Healthcare Providers

This classroom format is ideal for those who prefer group interaction and feedback from the instructor. Student materials include adult, child and infant CPR and AED information. The American Heart Association- HEALTHCARE Providers Basic Life Support course completion care is valid for two years and is required for all healthcare providers. During the course, an AHA instructor conducts video-based lessons and works with students to complete skills practice. Satisfactory completion of a written test and skills testing are required to receive the AHA Healthcare Provider card, which will be emailed to students within two weeks of completion. Instructor: Adam Alcorn. Cost: \$90

BLS Instructor

Train individuals when at home or in a workplace environment to overcome any reluctance to act in an emergency situation and to recognize and care for life threatening emergencies such as respiratory or cardiac distress and/or arrest, sudden illness, and injuries until advanced medical personnel arrive and take over; exceeds OSHA identified Standard First Aid guidelines.

ESHX 712 01 OSHA 10 - Core Skilled Trades

This 10-hour OSHA course will provide the basics of occupational safety and health. The training program is intended to provide entry-level general industry workers information about their rights, employer responsibilities, and how to file a complaint, as well as how to identify, abate, avoid, and prevent job-related hazards. Training topics will introduce employees to the basic practices of identifying, reducing, eliminating, and reporting hazards associated with their work. Course outcomes include increasing worker safety and helping employers decrease costs associated with accidents.

ESHX 712 03 OSHA Forklift Safety

You will learn about the OSHA rules for Powered Industrial Trucks and developing a forklift training program. This class does not offer forklift operator certification (cards).
