

Strategic planning is all about having a vision for where the College wants be in the future, and laying out a strategy to get there. KCC has implemented creative solutions to long-standing challenges.

Reducing Developmental Education

A challenge we have faced over the years has been 85% of new students are not ready for college and require developmental (remedial) classes. In 2013, KCC took steps to become part of the solution. We worked with high schools to develop several options for taking college classes while still in high school. We worked with our math and writing departments to develop new techniques, new classes, and new pathways for students. Through careful planning, KCC has eliminated status quo acceptance and has cut in half (see chart below) the number of remedial credits taken by students when they enter college, and has also reduced the amount of time students spend taking these classes.

Improving Klamath Business In 2014 KCC proposed a business incubation

a business incubation project, achieved funding in partnership with PSU, and birthed the **Klamath IDEA Center for Entrepreneurship**

Partners include OIT, OSU, SCOEDD, KCEDA, KCC, the Chamber of Commerce, SBDC, and Business Oregon.

Funding KCC Growth

Starting in 2013, KCC began seeking funding sources from outside the Klamath Basin.

The Resource Development Department researched funding histories to predict future opportunities. This strategy has paid off. Since 2013/14, the department acquired \$6,163,357 in grant funding.

KCC HAS IMPROVED KCC has aggressively tackled the challenge of bringing higher advection to attudents who of bringing higher education to students who would not be able to attend college at this point in their lives.

In just four years the College developed

- 6 different ways high school students can attend college classes
- 11 remote location sites
- 6 new fully online programs.

High School

These are just some of the methods, options KCC has developed for high school students to take college classes:

- College Now School districts provide bus transportation for students to attend classes on the KCC campus.
- Advanced Diploma Students may defer receiving their high school diploma. The schools then cover the cost of KCC tuition and books for the first year of college.
- **Dual enrollment** KCC faculty travel to local high schools to teach.
- **CNA** High schools provide financial support for students to receive training and testing on KCC campus to become Certified Nursing Assistants.

KCC HAS **IMPROVED PARTNERSHIPS**

KCC is deeply committed to the wellbeing of the community. As a small college, we know partnerships between the College and regional businesses and agencies are essential to success.

Lake County commissioners also provided funding for KCC to offer classes and training in Lake county.


KCC HAS **INCREASED EXCELLENCE**

KCC has gone beyond online courses to serve these remote communities with true excellence. KCC has modified classes, trained instructors, and installed live two-way teleconferencing equipment at 11 sites in Klamath and Lake counties.



Universities

Our university partnerships are outstanding in how closely the programs are designed to work together to provide no loss of credit for students.

Students may achieve a bachelor's degree entirely on KCC's campus. These include:

- SOU: Teacher Certification
- OSU: Agriculture
- EOU: Business Administration

Our partnership with OIT involves sharing resources, personnel, working space, funding sources, and technology.

The HR Department now deploys evaluation of all faculty, staff, and administrators, including the President.

The HR Department also has established a merit-based pay system, a concept unheard of in higher education.
