KCC College Now/College Online H.S. Program


All students are recommended to enroll into **KCC's CGS100** course titled **College Survival and Success**, a foundational course designed to equip you with the skills necessary for success in both online and college-level learning.

Steps to Enroll

Step 1: Express Interest

- Meet with your **high school counselor** or a **KCC advisor** to discuss your interest in taking courses through KCC.
- Review the **KCC Course Schedule** for the upcoming term and create a list of courses that interest you.
- Verify **prerequisites** for selected courses.
- Ensure selected courses align with your **high school graduation plan** and **post-secondary goals**

Step 2: Submit Required forms

- Complete the following forms:
 - KCC College Now/College Online High School Form
 - Student FERPA Release Form
- Submit both forms to **Tawni Ellis**, Accelerated Learning Coordinator

Step 3: Admission and Enrollment at KCC

- Tawni Ellis will:
 - Confirm your eligibility and check for prerequisites.
 - Enroll you in the course(s) if prerequisites are met.
- If unfamiliar with **Canvas**, KCC's online learning platform, you will be enrolled in a **free Canvas training course (approx. 1 hour)**.
- Upon enrollment, you will receive:
 - KCC Student ID**
 - Login credentials** for MyKCC and Canvas
- Log into MyKCC to view your enrolled courses (available on the first day of the term).
- Refer to the **KCC Academic Calendar** for important dates (e.g., term start, drop/withdrawal deadlines).

Step 4: Placement Testing (If required)

- If not previously completed, you are required to complete **placement tests** for:
 - **Math** (online test provided by Tawni Ellis)
 - **Writing** (schedule via KCC Testing Center: 541-880-2334)
- Submit test results to Tawni Ellis:
 - Math results will be emailed to student and include recommended courses. Student would have a choice of enrollment into one of the recommended math courses provided.
 - Writing results will include a placement score (e.g., 230), which determines course eligibility.
- If you've already taken placement tests or college-level math/writing courses:
 - Submit **official test results** or **transcripts** to Tawni.

Step 5: Tuition & Textbooks

- Tuition: **\$25.00 per credit** (plus applicable course fees if applicable to specific course plus cost of books materials if required).
- Purchase textbooks via the **KCC Bookstore Portal**:
 - *NC* = No-cost textbooks
 - *LC* = Low-cost textbooks
- Instructional video available on the portal.

Step 6: Register for Classes

- Work with **Tawni Ellis** to register for future approved courses.
- It is recommended to register through Tawni to ensure proper billing (many districts cover tuition when coordinated through school counselors).
- Confirm your schedule and course start dates.
- Regularly check your **KCC email** and **Canvas** for updates and instructor communication.
