Why should you use FAFSA on the Web?

- 1) It's free! You don't have to pay to apply for federal student aid.
- 2) It's fast! You'll get your results faster than you would using a mailed paper application. Because your answers are edited automatically, you'll make fewer mistakes and your school will be able to tell you sooner if you qualify for aid.
- 3) It's secure! Your data is secure. Encryption keeps your information safe when you submit your application.
- 4) It's easy! You're only asked the questions you need to answer because FAFSA on the Web automatically skips questions that don't apply to you.

Before you Begin

- 1) Gather documents showing your financial information and, if you're dependent, your parents' financial information:
 - Federal Income Tax Returns
 - W-2 Forms
 - Records of untaxed benefits received
 - Current bank statements
 - Records of other savings and investments

Applying for an FSA ID

- 1) The FSA ID serves as your identifier to let you access your personal information in various U.S. Department of Education systems. Because your FSA ID serves as your electronic signature, ***you should not give it to anyone.***
- 2) You can apply for an FSA ID at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Your FSA ID allows you to electronically sign when you submit your FAFSA. *If you are providing parent/guardian information, one of them must sign your FAFSA and will also require a PIN.*

Filing your FAFSA on the Web

- 1) Go to www.fafsa.ed.gov and select “**Start Here**”.
- 2) Now follow the onscreen instructions to fill out the application. The **Title IV School Code for KCC** is **034283**.
- 3) **IRS Data Retrieval Tool** -Students and parents who completed their 2019 IRS tax return will be able to use *FAFSA on the Web* to electronically view their tax information. **With just a few simple steps, the tax information can also be securely transferred into the FAFSA. This will prevent having to request a “Tax Transcript”, which can take weeks to obtain.**
Common barriers to successfully using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool:
 - ❑ If your marital status changed during the 2019 tax year or you filed an amended tax return, you will not be eligible to use this tool
 - ❑ When using the Data Retrieval Tool, use only alpha numeric text (number and letters), no punctuation (. , # /).
 - ❑ If something was misspelled on your tax return, it must also be misspelled when using the Data Retrieval Tool for the records to match.
- 4) After inserting your information, click the “**Submit My FAFSA**” button at the **bottom** of the screen to send your application through the Internet. You will be taken to a screen that says, “Your application has been submitted.”

Helpful hints about Financial Aid

- 1) Apply early! You can apply as soon as October 1 of the year prior.
- 2) You don’t need to file your tax return before you submit your FAFSA. Once you file your tax return, you must correct any incorrect information. For the 2021-2022 FAFSA use your 2019 taxes.
- 3) You may be required to present verification documents to the school’s financial aid office. For your financial aid package to be processed in a timely fashion, be sure to pay close attention to any required deadlines or requests for additional documentation.
